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Position statement on the use of AI

AMT is aware that many industry practitioners are incorporating Al tools into their practice. While these tools promise to meaningfully reduce paperwork, they also present important professional, ethical, and legal considerations that need to be carefully navigated.

AMT has developed a position statement on the use of AI to support the ethical and lawful adoption of AI tools. It is available for download <u>here</u>.

Refusal of Treatment

AMT has also developed a member fact sheet on refusal of treatment which covers:

- legitimate reasons for refusing treatment, from scope of practice to safety
- ethical boundaries and professional standards
- practical steps for handling refusals professionally
- what to do if a client continues unwanted contact after refusal.

Health Care Provider identifiers (HPI-I)

AMT continues to work with Services Australia to have eligible members assigned with a Healthcare Provider Identifier.

However, next steps are dependent on proposed legislative changes to the Healthcare Identifiers Act 2010. The most recent advice AMT has received is that the legislative changes are intended for the spring sitting of Parliament.

The systematic review checklist consists of 10 questions which are designed to assess the validity, results, and applicability of a study. These will provide a useful entry point for students learning how to appraise evidence. The traffic light system used to grade studies simplifies the process of evaluating the quality of evidence.



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The full suite of supporting materials also includes a <u>user guide</u> that outlines the search string used to compile the resource.
